COMMAND COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION

1. Mission - USS STERETT (CG 31) is a Josephus Daniels class guided missile cruiser whose primary missions are anti-aircraft, anti-submarine and anti-surface warfare.
2. Organizational Structure - STERETT is assigned to Commander Naval Surface Group Western Pacific. The Commanding Officer is Captain Richard P. Genet. STERETT's homeport is Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines.

USS STERETT (CG 31)
COMMAND HISTORY 1987

STERETT began the New Year inport Subic Bay, RP finishing a holiday upkeep period, followed by a short port visit to Hong Kong during the first week of 1987. STERETT returned to Subic Bay on 10 January to begin final preparations for the upcoming deployment to Hawaii.

During the transit to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, STERETT embarked Commander, Destroyer Squadron Seventeen for three days during which time he observed the training exercise Busy Observer. Upon arrival in Pearl Harbor on 28 January, STERETT's crew began completing various training including SAR, fire fighting and General Damage Control Training for the entire crew. Additionally, numerous inspections were conducted and the Combat Systems Sea Qualifications Test was successfully completed.

STERETT departed Pearl Harbor on 15 March to return to Subic Bay. Prior to pulling into port on 31 March, the ship participated in a Naval Gunfire Support Exercise at Tabones Range on 30 March. After arrival, preparations began for ISIC Engineering Inspection which was conducted from 6-8 April. This was followed by the Command Inspection on 15 April.

After a brief upkeep period, STERETT was underway again for operations with Battle Group ALFA in the South China Sea, followed by a port visit to Hong Kong on 5 May. Leaving Hong Kong on 10 May, the ship headed south, stopped briefly in Subic Bay, then made two port visits in Australia. The first stop was Sydney for four days, followed by four days in Melbourne.

Leaving Melbourne on 15 June, the ship participated in operations with Battle Group ALFA in and around the Philippine Sea until 4 July, when STERETT returned to her home port for three days. This was followed by a brief four day underway period prior to beginning Selected Repair Availability Five.

Upon completion of SRA-5, STERETT began a series of brief underway periods in preparation for her upcoming deployment. During this period, STERETT crewmembers hosted Admiral Lewin, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Philippines, along with many of the crew's families during the dependents cruise. Included in the final preparations for deployment were the Combat Systems Readiness Test and a missile firing exercise, both of which were completed successfully.

Transiting through the Straits of Malacca into the North Arabian Sea, STERETT operated with Battle Group ALFA from 10 November through the end of the year. During the Christmas Holidays, STERETT spent four days in Muscat, Oman. Senator Edward Kennedy of Massachusetts visited with the officers and men of STERETT, relaying greetings from President Reagan and commenting on the superb job the U.S. Navy is doing in the Persian Gulf area. Crewmembers had the opportunity to have Christmas dinners with local American families while in Oman, in addition, many enjoyed shopping, tours and sporting events.

After leaving Muscat, STERETT proceeded south to the vicinity of Masirah, Oman for a two day tender availability with USS CAPE COD. On the second day, STERETT's crew, along with the crews from USS CAPE COD and USS FRANCIS HAMMOND were entertained by the Dallas Cowboy Cheerleaders during their holiday tour of the region. After departing CAPE COD, STERETT embarked Commander, Joint Task Force Middle East, Rear Admiral Dennis M. Brooks.

CAPTAIN RICHARD P. GENET
UNITED STATES NAVY

Captain Richard Paul Genet is a native of Barrington, Illinois and graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland in 1965. He served in the weapons, operations and engineering departments in USS KEPPLER (DD 765) and USS BLUE (DD 744), as Executive Officer of USS RAMSEY (FFG 2) and USS NEW JERSEY (BB 62) and commanded USS LIPAN (ATF 85), USS PLUCK (MSO 464) and USS SELLERS (DDG 11). Captain Genet's shore assignments include Director of Advanced Projects and, subsequently, Director of Data Processing at the Fleet Combat Direction Systems Support Activity, San Diego; and Head, Combat Systems Support Branch, Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Washington, D.C.

Captain Genet holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering from the Naval Academy; a Master of Science Degree in Computer Science from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California, where he also graduated from the pilot Weapons Systems Acquisition Management curriculum. He is a graduate of the Naval War College and the Armed Forces Staff College with Distinction. He has been awarded the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal with Gold Star in lieu of Second Award, the Navy Commendation Medal with Gold Star and combat device, and various campaign medals and foreign awards.

Captain Genet is married to the former Jane Kennedy Dodson of Washington, D.C. They have six children: Michael, Sabra, Clare, Juliette, Richard and Danielle.

Captain Genet assumed command of USS STERETT on 27 September 1986 during ceremonies at Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines.
