

On 18 October, Sterett started her 8 month journey to upgrade several weapons systems to increase the ships lethality!






We recently received the following message from CDR Sean Lewis, CO DDG 104:

On the cusp of the holiday season I would like to say Happy Holidays to all of our STERETT Association shipmates!

We have passed our first full month of 8 months for STERETT's depot level maintenance period. The ship is safely docked and a significant amount of work has begun at the BAE shipyard. Of note, both port and starboard propellers and shafting have been removed, all fuel oil tanks have been opened for inspection and touch up, preparation work has begun for major installations to support our newest Information Technology (IT) backbone, Sonar suite and Electronic Warfare suite.

Currently, the maintenance environment has challenged several commands and the shipyards alike to complete the scheduled maintenance phases on time. I am proud to say the ship, at this point, is on track to meet all milestones for completion of the maintenance phase. I focus on this as our Sailors are the main driver for this success and I am extremely proud of their effort to ensure that STERETT and the Sailors who man her remain the most lethal warship and crew in the Pacific.

None of us who have followed the DDG 104 since 2008 are surprised to hear Sterett has exceeded the performance of other ships. It's what ships named Sterett have always done!

Boys Town Vietnam Memorial Tribute


Back in September, Mike Smith, Sterett shipmate and Boys Town class of '67 announced a drive to establish a Boys Town Vietnam Memorial Tribute to honor the Boys Town graduates who were killed in Vietnam.

Boys Town High School was a community of 400 boys from all over the country thrown together because they were orphaned, came from impoverished or abusive families, or had been in trouble with the law. Boys Town had 20 students killed in Vietnam; an extraordinary number from one school.

It has been 50 years since they perished as 19 year old combat soldiers...and time that they were recognized.

At the end of July, 2019 – The Village of Boys Town, NE will officially be added to the Purple Heart Trail, and be proclaimed a Purple Heart Community. The ceremony will be held as a part of our regular Biennial Reunion at Boys Town, usually attended by about 500 participants (alumni and their families) from all over the country. Sponsorship of the Purple Heart Community is by the Boys Town National Alumni Association, and the Military Order of the Purple Heart. During the ceremony honoring our veterans, and purple heart recipients, we intend to unveil the engraved Statue and announce its placement the following month in the care of a trustee.

The Sterett Association made a small contribution to this cause and we are pleased to say the funding goal was achieved.


