## Tribute to a DD 407 Shipmate

After DD 407 shipmate Jim Botkin passed away in 2012, his family paid tribute to him by purchasing a memorial brick at the National WWII Museum in New Orleans.

I recently paid a visit to the museum and was determined to locate Jim's brick.

Not an easy task. The bricks are laid out on the sidewalks all around the museum and do not seem to be in a logical order. Even armed with the location, I had difficulty locating it.

However, there is a master map maintained by the docents. With their help, I was able to find Jim's brick. The museum is undergoing expansion and the area it was in was covered by construction dust. I was able to clean it up just enough to get a picture.



I was not impressed with the memorial brick project. There is no signage indicating where they are and what they're about. The bricks are part of the sidewalks all around the museum and without any signage, the visitors just walk around on what should be hallowed ground.

However, the National WWII Museum is a fascinating place and worth a visit.
