At sea, he has served as Auxiliaries Officer and First Lieutenant aboard USS RUSSELL (DDG 59); Navigator and Weapons Officer aboard USS ANZIO (CG 68); and Operations Officer aboard USS HALSEY (DDG 97) and USS MOBILE BAY (CG 53). Commander Koy most recently was the Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of USS STERETT (DDG 104),

completing a deployment to the Middle East, Africa, and Western Pacific.

Ashore, he served at the U.S. Naval Academy as a Seamanship and Navigation Instructor, Flag Secretary for the Superintendent, and Executive Secretary for the U.S. Naval Academy Board of Visitors. He also served as
